YEAR 4 FALCONS NEWSLETTER

Dear Parents,

I would like to start by taking this opportunity to welcome you to Year 4. It is brilliant to have all the children back and I hope you had a lovely summer. Year 4 will bring new challenges and exciting opportunities for the children. It is important that together we encourage them to approach everything they do with a positive attitude.

Maths

In our Maths lessons, we will be covering the following areas: place value, adding and subtracting numbers, and multiplication and division. We will develop the children's conceptual understanding of mathematics by using concrete objects, pictorial representations and abstract thinking.

Thematic

This term our topic will be the Ancient Greece. We will be finding out lots of information about how the Greeks lived in ancient times and the important contributions they made to philosophy, mathematics, astronomy, and medicine.

The children will also learn its location and climate zone.

P.E

On Tuesday and Wednesday afternoons, the children will have P.E. Please ensure your child has the correct P.E kit on these days: shorts/tracksuit bottoms and white Tshirts. Please make sure all items of your child's P.E kit are named.

Uniform

Please check all items of your child's uniform, coats and bags are clearly labelled to help them become more responsible and independent.

English

This term in English, we will be reading 'Charlotte's web' and 'The Polar Express'. Our writing pieces will be based around these texts.

Alongside our work on our class novels, we will continue to practise our comprehension skills, handwriting skills, learn and practise spellings and improve our grammar.

Science

During the first half term, our topic will be Animals including humans. The children will learn about the digestive system, describing what happens in each part. They will also learn about the four types of teeth and their functions.

After half term, our topic will be Living things and their habitats. Here the children will learn about living things in a range of habitats and the key features that helped them to identify them.

Reading

Just a few minutes reading with your child each day makes a huge difference. Please ensure your child has their reading book in school every day. We appreciate your help to look after your child's reading book and record. Please ensure the reading record is signed regularly and is kept in your child's book bag.

PSHE

During the first half term, our topic will be 'Being Me in My World'. Here the children will learn how they fit into the school community, understand how democracy works in school, their roles and responsibilities and how they can contribute to the overall outcome in their group.

After the half term, our topic will be 'Celebrating Difference'. The children will identify what is special about them, appreciate their unique features and learn to accept people the way they are.



Homework

Homework will be sent home on Friday and should be handed back in by the following Wednesday. Spellings will be sent home on Friday and tested the following Friday. Please ensure your child practises their spellings on **Spelling Shed**. These will increasingly be linked to a particular spelling pattern or rule each week and it is important that the children recognise this to further their understanding of spelling and grammar. We will also send Maths homework, often.

Special events

On the 26th of October, we will be visited by some Greek experts where we will learn all about how the Greeks lived.

On the 27th of November is our Advent assembly.

There are many whole school events going on this term, so please refer back to the Burnt Tree Newsletter for these dates.

Important information

In Year 4, there is a big emphasis on **times tables** and learning the times tables securely. Year 4 will be tested in their times tables at the beginning of June, so it is very important that your child is practising these at home. They can do this by:

- Logging onto Timestables Rockstars at home (10 mins per day)
- Practising them with a parent
