We are continuing to learn all about spring this half term. We have the exciting arrival of chick eggs. We will learn about and observe the changes that happen as the chicks hatch out of the eggs. We are also looking forward to getting in the garden to do lots of planting and growing.

How you can support at home:

Reading together – Spend a few minutes each day reading with your child. This helps build a love for books and strengthens early literacy skills.



Talk about the season – Discuss the changes in weather, what happens to the trees and their leaves and any other observations you make about spring and summer. This will reinforce what we are learning about at school.



Outdoor Play – Now the weather is getting warmer, outdoor play is a wonderful way to explore and develop the world around us. Enjoy looking at flowers, planting and growing in the garden, or spending time together as a family having a picnic at the park.
