Reading

- Maintain the % of pupils reaching the expected and higher standard by the end of KS2

Writing

- Whole school focus on developing children's vocabulary and basic skills (including handwriting).
- Ensure that SEND and PP children are supported through a range of means during the writing process, including timely interventions when required.

Maths

- Maintain the % of pupils reaching the expected and higher standard by the end of KS2
- Narrow the attainment gap between disadvantaged and nondisadvantaged pupils.
- Ensure that progress from KS1 to KS2 is maintained.
- Ensure that interventions for pupils on the SEND register and those who
 need to catch up are effective through same-day interventions.
- Continue to increase opportunities to use and apply mathematical skills across all curriculum areas.
- Continue to implement a mastery curriculum through the use of White Rose Maths and support from the Maths Hub
- Ensure that there are opportunities for teaching to include concrete, pictorial and abstract approaches.

Science

- Ensure that there are displays around the school reflectiong all areas of the subject and the expected standard for each KS.
- Continue to monitor planning to ensure that curriculum coverage is appropriate for all year groups.

Computing

- Ensure British Values are promoted throughout the school and children understand and are aware of what they mean.
